FINANCIAL AFFAIRS AND MEDICAID/MEDICARE BENEFITS-CONTINUED

Personal Funds

As a resident you have the right to manage your own financial affairs and are not required to deposit your personal funds with the facility. However, if you choose, the facility shall, upon receipt of your express written authorization, hold, safeguard, and account for personal funds you desire to deposit with the facility. Such deposits will be managed in accordance with the requirements of state and federal law, which, among other things, require that funds in excess of \$50 be maintained in an interest bearing account. You or your legal representative shall at all times be accorded access to your financial record. The facility will maintain, and not less than quarterly, provide you with a complete written accounting of all personal funds with which you have entrusted it. Any resident personal funds deposited with the facility will not be co-mingled with the facilities funds. The facility will not impose a charge against your personal funds for any item or service for which payment is made under Medicaid or Medicare.

Eligibility for Medicare & Medicaid Coverage

You have the right to receive, and the facility will provide, both oral and written information regarding application and use Medicare and Medicaid benefits, and how to apply for refunds of previous payments covered by such benefits. In addition, provisions in Wisconsin law specify a level of assets and income that may be retained by your spouse, residing outside the nursing home, without affecting your eligibility for Medicaid benefits. The effect of the law is to avoid requiring the spouse outside the home to impoverish him or herself in order to make the other spouse (residing in the nursing home) eligible for Medicaid. If you have specific questions about how these provisions affect you, you are encouraged to contact the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) or Northern Income Maintenance Consortium which determines your Medical Assistance eligibility.

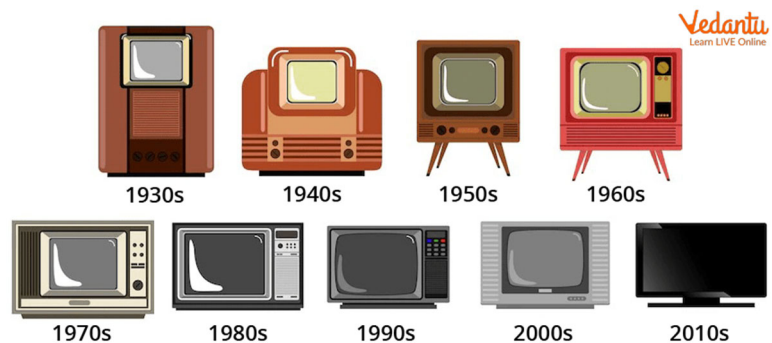

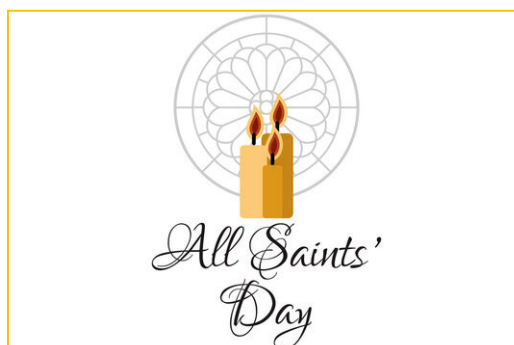

FLY FISHING

A few weeks ago, I read a book, San County Almanac by Alden Leopold. Early in the first part it caught my full attention, it mirrored exactly my experiences until my father fly fishing for trout and on fishing river trips on the North Fork of the Flambeau River. My father and Alden Leopold were about the same age. Then the book is a study of ecology with illustrations of animals, very precise and in depth, I followed him wandering the trout stream and in the Flambeau river boat with another man from park Falls. We fished by a print shop where there is now a plumber shop on fourth street across from where the old Catholic Church was, then I was not a fly caster. I was a warm fisherman we often fished Butternut Creek, which was then a great stream for the trout. The St. Croix rod company brought in a formed fly cast from the West. My father outdid him on a fishing trip. Butternut Creek is no longer a great trout stream. The North Fork of the Flambeau is still a great river trip I went with my father, the scenic view there hasn't changed too much. My father also fished the Flambeau Flowage, which is the headwaters of the Flambeau River. Our family often fished there, and we came back with a gun sack full of fish. A gunnysack is a normal green sack. Alden Leopold died at 63 years old. My father lived to be 100 years old.

I am now 100 years old.
