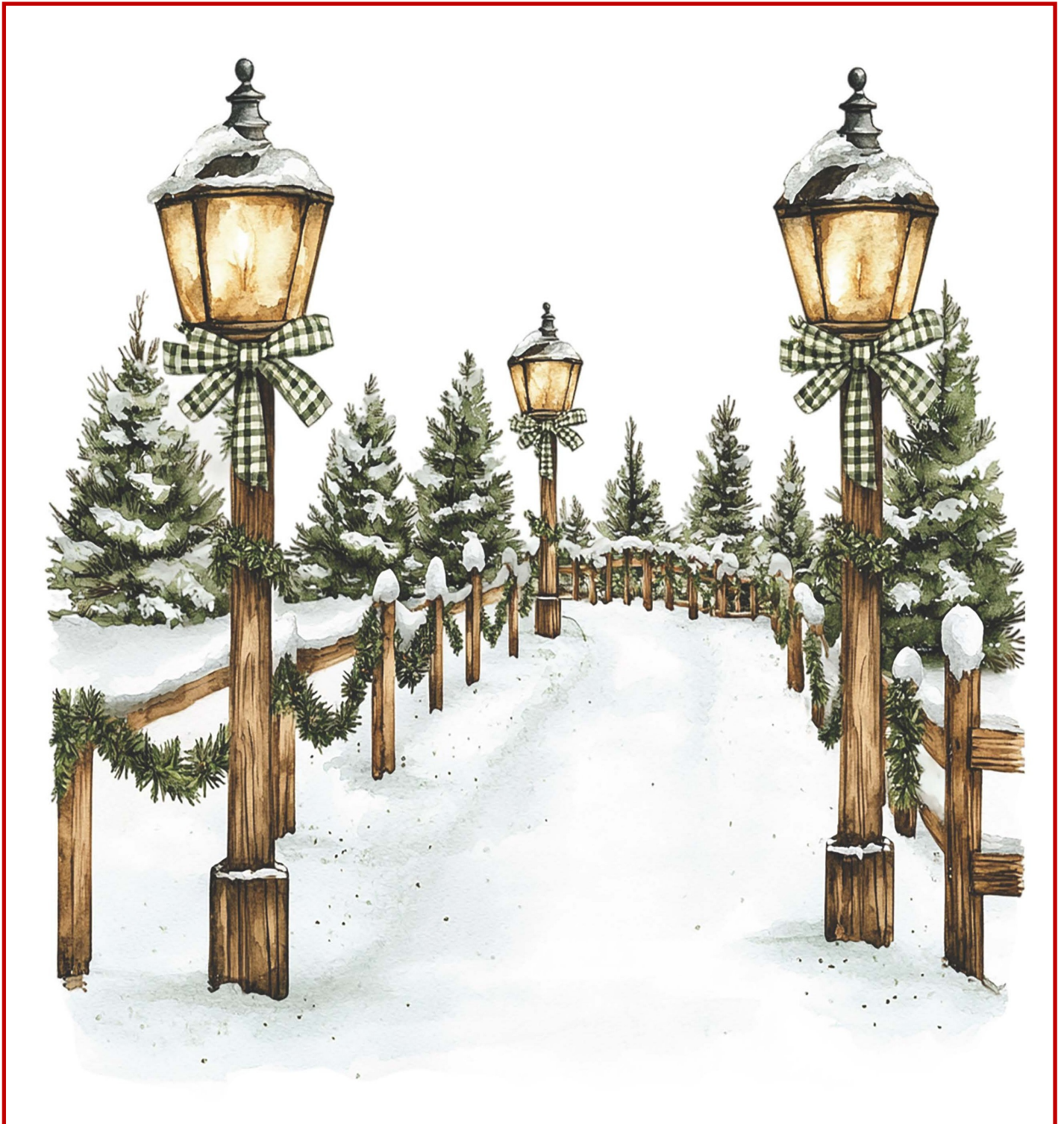

11. TRANSFERS AND DISCHARGES



Transfer or Discharge from the Facility

This facility has established and maintains identical policies and practices regarding transfer, discharge and the provision of services for all residents regardless of source of payment.

This facility recognizes, and will honor, your right to remain in its care. You will not be permanently or temporarily transferred or discharged from this facility, except (1) with you, your resident representative, or your legal representative's voluntary written consent or (2) unless, the transfer or discharge is necessary for your welfare and your needs can no longer be met in the facility;

- The transfer or discharge is appropriate because your health has significantly improved and you are no longer in need of the services this facility provides;
- The failure to discharge would endanger the health or safety of the resident or other individuals in the facility;
- The facility will document the danger that failure to transfer or discharge would pose.
- You have failed, after reasonable and appropriate notice, to pay for the care and services you have received from the facility;
- The facility ceases to operate;
- The transfer or discharge is for medical reasons as ordered by a physician;
- As otherwise permitted by state or federal law.

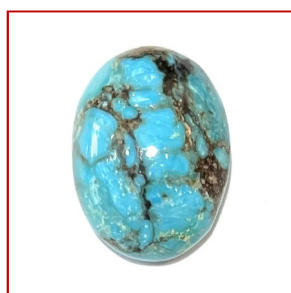
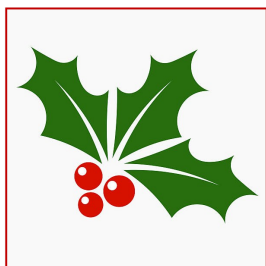

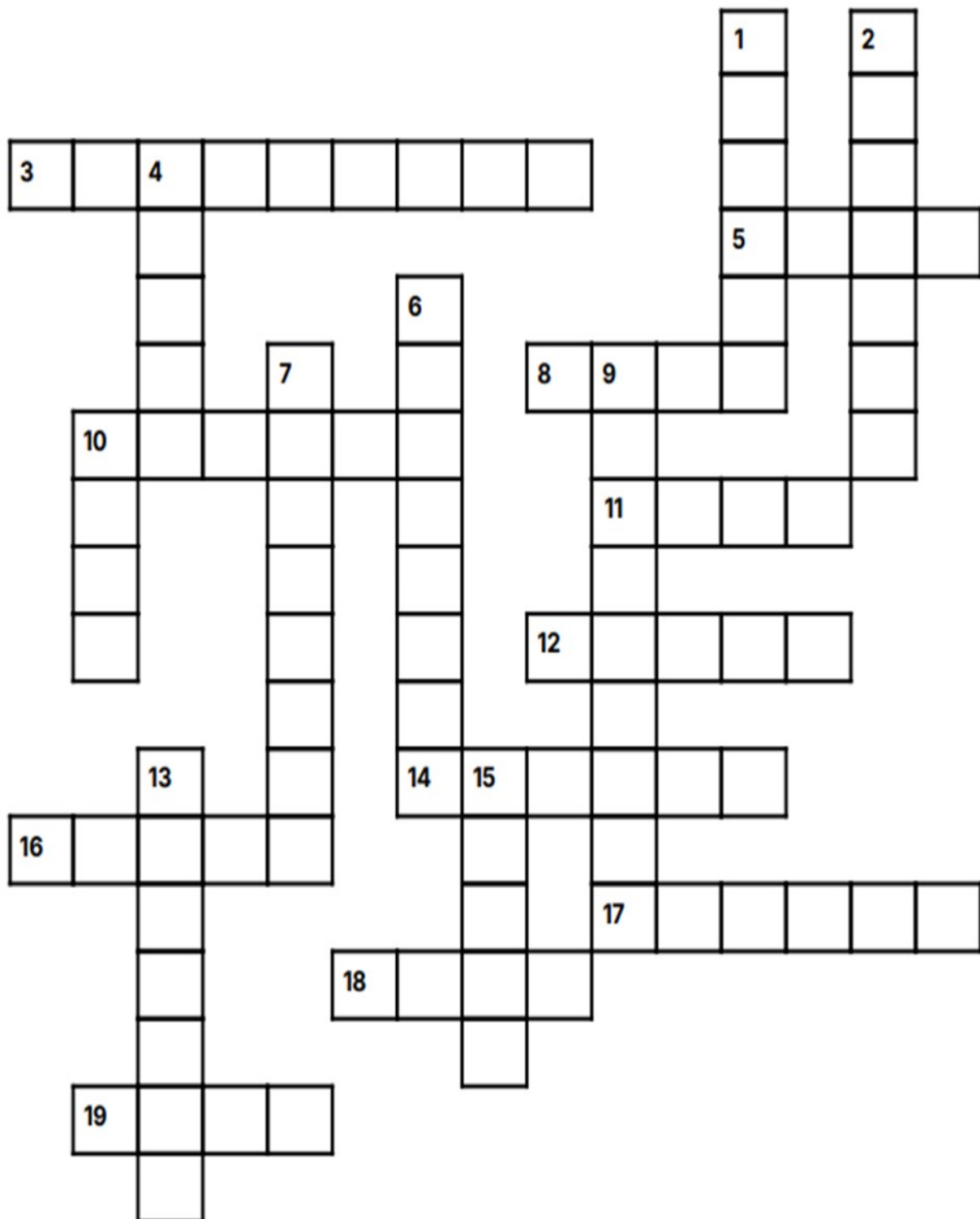
