3. DIGNITY AND RESPECT

This facility will care for each of its residents in a manner and in an environment that promotes maintenance or enhancement of each resident's quality of life.

We will promote your right to receive care and treatment in a manner and in an environment that promotes maintenance or enhancement of your quality of life, dignity, and respect in full recognition of your individuality. The state and federal survey agents are also responsible for treating you in a manner that maintains and enhances your dignity and respect in full recognition of your individuality.

You have the right to reside and receive services in this facility with reasonable accommodation of your individual needs and preferences, except when the health or safety of you or others would be endangered.

You have the right to:

- A. Choose activities, schedules which include sleeping and waking times, health care and health care providers of health care services consistent with your interest, assessments, and care plans.
- B. Interact with members of the community both in and out of the facility and participate in community activities.
- C. Make choices about aspects of your life in the facility that are significant to you.

You, as a resident, have the right to be free from the imposition of physical or chemical restraints administered for the purposes of discipline or convenience and which are not required to treat your medical symptoms.

You have the right to be free from verbal, sexual, physical or mental abuse, corporal punishment and voluntary seclusion. This facility has developed and implemented written policies and procedures that prohibit mistreatment, neglect, exploitation or abuse.

strong melodious songs.

Independence Day Trivia Fact Sheet

Did You Know?

- ❖ **The Declaration Date:** The Continental Congress actually voted to declare independence on July 2, 1776, but the written document was officially adopted two days later on July 4th.
- ❖ **Not Signed on the 4th:** Most of the delegates did not sign the Declaration of Independence until August 2, 1776!
- ❖ **The Bell Rings:** Every Independence Day, the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not swung, to protect it) exactly 13 times to honor the original 13 colonies.
- ❖ **Presidential Coincidences:** Three U.S. Presidents passed away on July 4th: John Adams and Thomas Jefferson in 1826 (exactly 50 years after the Declaration), and James Monroe in 1831.
- ❖ **A Presidential Birthday:** Calvin Coolidge was the only U.S. President born on the 4th of July (born in 1872).
- ❖ **Hot Dog Holiday:** Americans consume roughly 150 million hot dogs on the 4th of July alone.
- ❖ **The National Anthem:** "The Star-Spangled Banner" wasn't made the official national anthem until 1931, over 100 years after it was written.

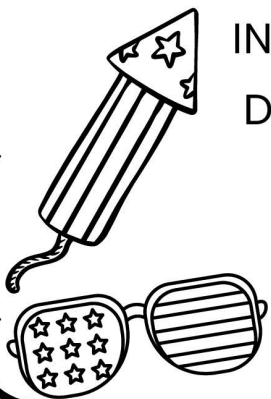
