2. PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIALITY

You have the right to privacy in accommodations, medical treatment, written and telephone communications, personal care, visits and meetings of family and resident groups. You have the right to refuse to allow the state surveyor to observe personal cares or treatment. You may ask them to leave anytime you are not comfortable with them being present. They should ask for your consent prior to observing personal cares and treatment.

You have the right to send and receive your mail promptly and unopened; including letters, packages, and other materials delivered to the facility through means other than postal services. You have the right to reasonable and private access to use of a telephone, and to retain a cellular phone at your own expense. The facility will protect and facilitate your right to communicate with individuals and entities within and external to the facility, including reasonable access to:

- Stationary, postage and writing implements, at your expense.
- The internet, to the extent available to the facility.
- Telephone services including TTY and TDD services.

You have the right to reasonable access and privacy in your use of electronic communications such as email, video communications, and for internet research if access is available to the facility. These accommodations will be at your expense if any additional expense is incurred by the facility to provide this access. Such use must comply with state and federal law. You have the right to approve or refuse the release of your personal and medical records to any individual outside this facility, except when:

- You are transferred to another health care institution; or
- When the release of the records is required by law or a third party payment contract.

You have the right to examine your current personal and medical records within 24 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) upon an oral or written request. You have the right to obtain a copy of your personal and medical records upon request, in the form and format requested which may include electronic form or format for records maintained electronically, following your oral or written request and including two working days advance notice to the facility. To protect the privacy of your records, if request is made to view your medical records by someone other than yourself, the facility will ask that the request be made in writing. The facility will, consistent with State law, permit examination of your clinical records by a representative of the state ombudsman office only with your permission or that of your legal representative.

If you desire to purchase copies of your records, you will be charged labor for copying records in both paper and electronic form, supplies, and postage as applicable.
